Membership dues are a sign of your NSC support

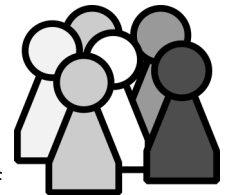
Paying membership dues to Newburgh Senior Center is not mandatory. We welcome all folks, 55 and older, regardless of their ability to pay.

However, if you want to go with us on any of our jaunts, you need to be a paid member because of our liability.

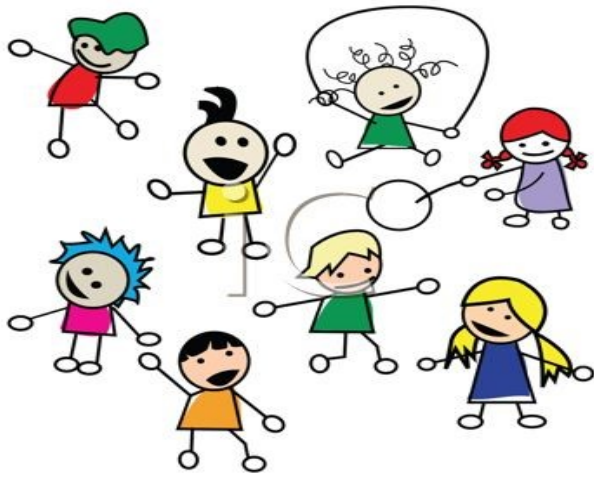
That being said, thank you to all those who have already paid their 2016 memberships. We hope you will continue to attend events we sponsor and invite your friends to join our activities.

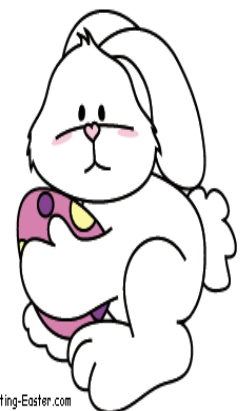

Hope Central offers services to our Warrick county community aimed at diminishing the effects of poverty and assisting disadvantaged individuals in stabilizing and strengthening their families. *Hope Central* is located near the town square in Boonville and serves over 450 households each month through its various programs, all offered and run by volunteers. Volunteer help is currently needed in several areas:

(1) **Manna Market:** assist clients as they shop for food on Monday or Tuesday evening, then help restock shelves.

Hours are from 4:45 – 7:30pm

(2) **Walmart 'Feed America':** Drive the *HC* van once a week to pick up food and supplies from the Boonville Walmart; then unload and sort that delivery between 12:30 – 2:30pm.

(3) **Building Upkeep:** Handle periodic light maintenance and/or cleaning; flexible times, usually during weekday afternoons.
