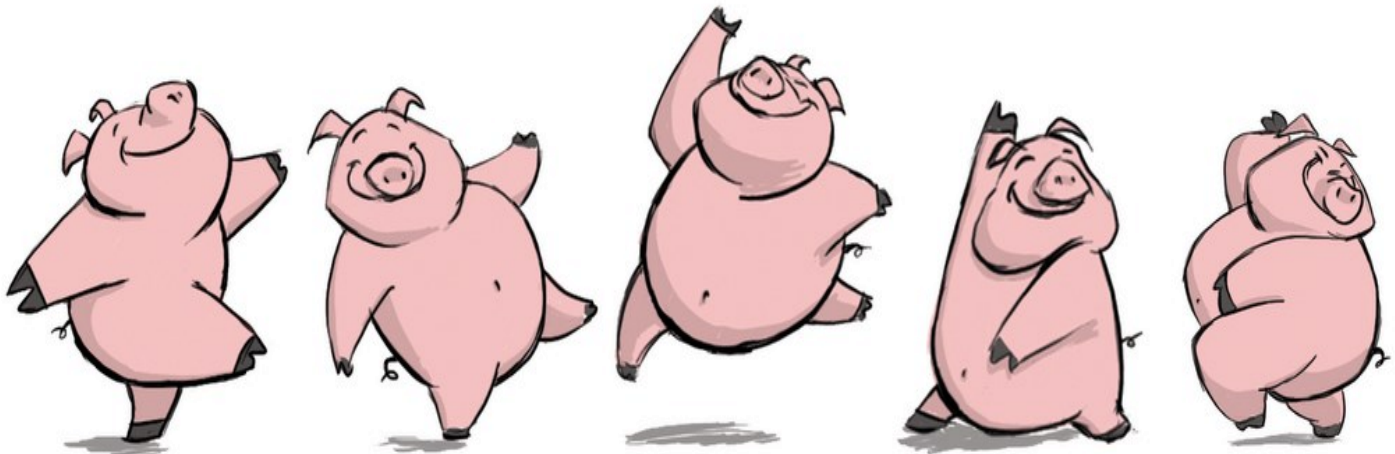
There's more good news about Porkapalooza 2022. **Newburgh BBQ Coalition will, for the tenth year in a row, be smoking the Porkapalooza pork products!** You can order full slabs of ribs, tenderloins, and quarts of pulled pork (with a delicious secret sauce).

Lunches of pulled pork sandwiches, chips, and a drink will be available to the public on October 7 and 8 for \$5 each, from 11 am-2 pm, on a drive through basis. If you would like to order more than four lunches, please call the Center at least 30 minutes ahead of your preferred pick-up time, so we can have them ready for you. You are also welcome to call in large orders during the week prior to Porkapalooza, so our volunteers know how many to prepare and the time you will need them.

Prices remain the same as last year, despite rising costs! Pork orders should be pre-paid to guarantee Newburgh BBQ Coalition smokes enough meat for everyone.

- **Full slabs of ribs are \$35**
- **Smoked tenderloins are \$15 each or two for \$25**
- **Quarts of pulled pork are \$25** (these freeze wonderfully)

Order pick up will be Saturday, October 8, 11 am-2 pm at the Senior Center.

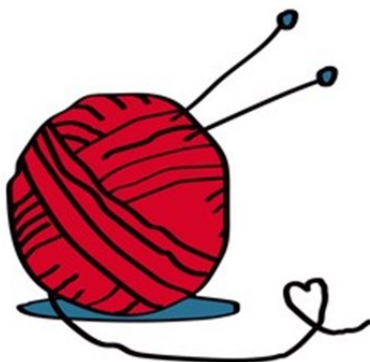
